



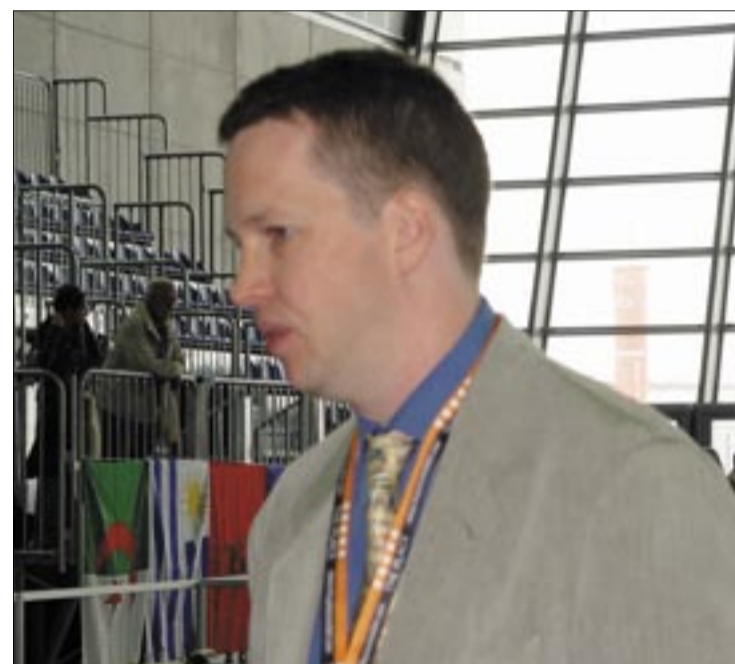

## Russian juggernaut steams ahead

**R**ussia initiated the campaign for regaining the Olympic crown in cavalier fashion with clean sweep in successive rounds and emerged at the top of the table with 8 points. A rejuvenated Russian team got past Latvia by 4 -0 with an awesome display by the Russian Grandmasters

The top board match was keenly contested and Russian grandmasters coming through in the crucial phase of the game . Morozevich Alexander played an interesting game against GM Miezis Normunds where he left his rook on h1 and conducted a complicated middle game Morozevich had the bishop pair took control of the position and he managed to transpose into an won ending .

The passed pawn in king side clinched the issue Grischuk Alexander won a close match against GM Fridman Daniel in a double knight endgame. Grichuk outmaneuvered the Latvian grandmaster and won with effective technique in the endgame.

Holland conceded 2 draws to Bangladesh and managed to win by a 3 -1 margin. While Russia topped the table with 8 points taking a slender half point lead. Poland, Germany, Serbia & Montenegro and Greece notched up excellent victories by a margin of 3.5 to 5 and moved to the second spot with 7.5 points.

Serbia & Montenegro blanked Costa Rica by 4 - 0 to join the top teams. Australia pulled off an brilliant victory over Romania by 3-1 aided by the wins by Grandmaster Ian Rogers and IM Zhao Zong-Yuan defeated GM Istratescu Andrei and GM Vajda Levente.

Turkey, Netherlands Slovakia China Iceland Vietnam Australia Uzbekistan and Ukraine are in third spot with 7 points. The key matches for the third round are Russia vs Germany Poland vs Greece Ukraine Serbia & Montenegro Turkey Netherlands Slovakia China Iceland Vietnam and Australia vs Uzbekistan.

**I**n the women's Olympiad China took a slender lead with 6 points by trouncing England by 3 -0 . Despite the fact that the Chinese women team missing some of its star players their depth in talent and determination has propelled them to the top of the ranking Russia defeated Kazakhstan by 2.5 to 0.5 to share the lead with 5.5 points alongside Italy A team and Hungary. Italy conceded a draw on top board but swept the lower boards to surge ahead. Vietnam held India to a draw by 1.5 to 1.5 while the second seed Georgia dropped a point against Belorussia's. Anna Sharevich defeated IM Lomineishvili Maia in a keenly contested match.



# Chess in Australia

**I**nterview with Lenoid Sandler team captain of Australian women's team and international master.

Junior chess is on the fast track in Australia with fifty thousand children playing chess. The project of introducing chess in schools has led to dramatic increase in number of young players. around 15 companies and small private chess trainers are involved in the chess coaching at Schools. Although the Government support and grant will accelerate the development.

The Australian team has taken great effort to be here at the chess Olympiad. we are here for the love of the game country and "Gens Una Sumus" that we are one family. chess coaching in schools is around 80 to 100 Australian dollars The major events are Australian open and closed which is held alternately. Apart from that there are few weekend

tournaments canebara in easter break The major cities where chess is happening are Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane.

The 2006 Australian Chess Grand Prix is a series of rated weekend chess tournaments held across Australia throughout the calendar year. Tournament organizers register for the Grand Prix (GP) in advance and Individual.

Players score points in their best events and the GP standings are published. The player with maximum grand pre points is awarded the title and a cash prize throughout the year. Prizes are awarded Brian Jones of Australian of Chess Enterprises is the Grand Prix Director for 2006. There are five classes of tournament. Eligibility is determined by the cash value of the guaranteed main prizes offered in the Open section. this is an ambitious program to popularize chess.

# Chess in China

**I**n 2005 china sent a team of young talents to the Dubai open chess championship. It was for the first time that china had participated in such a strong open tournament and with shock and awe 17 year old Wang Yu won the tournament convincingly. He later went on won the strong Malaysian open as well. so we wanted to find out the recipe for success of china. Zhong zhang china ELO rated 2640 spoke to Turin moves Chinese chess is at the top rankings of the world due to a combination of factors we have intelligence and competitive and coaching program very good. We have chess in schools and government support along with professional approach.

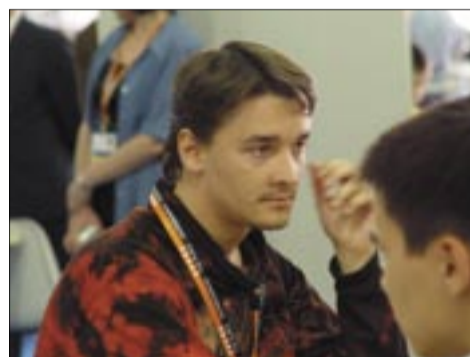
The famous chess player Ye, Jiangchuan the coach and chairman of chess association is the chief coach China chess awakening of a dragon. There are many tournaments and Chinese chess league in China is spread over 6 months our players are well known we also play the dynamic Chinese chess which is the reason why the style is tactical oriented. In selection of Chinese team from national championship and by ELO rating in team events we are close to challenging any team in chess Olympiad and world chess championship but for individual success we have to work more and aim for success. There are many talent and the winner of Dubai and Malaysian open did not qualify such is the depth of talent and strength in china.

There are three forms of chess which are being played regularly in China. Weiqi (Go) originated in China for several centuries but during the 20th century, the Japanese were the masters of the game. Weiqi became popular only when Chen Zude became the first Chinese to defeat a top Japanese Grandmaster 20 years ago. Today, Weiqi is the most popular chess game among the Chinese and several of such competitions offer very attractive prize money. Xiangqi (Chinese Chess) also originated in China and one could see older folks enjoy this game along the streets. Chess was introduced in China during the 19th century but had never been as popular as Weiqi and Xiangqi.

Alekhine was the first great chess player to visit China in 1933. In an exhibition played in Shanghai, he was held to two draws, china gave notice of their arrival in the 1980 chess Olympiad when an unknown Chinese player had defeated the Dutchman hans donner. Since then china has become a dominant chess country in Asia and now challenging the world. In an recent tournament 700 children contesting the age-group championships; for Chess. More astounding was that more than 400 spectators witnessed the matches along the street eagerly waiting for their children's results. The events were restricted to schools within Beijing City Center and did not include schools in the northern, southern, eastern and western regions which have their own competitions.

# RUSSIA (men) takes the sole lead

**Y**esterday's round saw a lot of unclear battles, except in the match number one where Russian team crushed Latvians and took the sole lead with perfect score after two rounds! It would be too early, of course, to give some prognostics, but their march looks frightening up to now. Since Kramnik still didn't show up in the team, it will be interesting to see their line up for round three. Will they break the rule which says: «Never change the winning team»?



Only one more perfect victory was achieved in first 30 matches – SCG (Serbia and Montenegro) against Costa Rica.

Other favourites won as well, but after facing more problems. Germany, Poland, Ukraina,



China and Uzbekistan cashed 3,5 points, while Netherlands, Iceland, Turkey, Slovakia



and Vietnam put on their account half a point less. The surprise of the day was a clear victory (3:1) of Australia against Romania. Four teams are now just half a point behind Russia: Germany, Poland, Greece and SCG. The most interesting matches of the round 3 will be Russia-Germany, Poland-Greece and Ukraina-SCG.



As for Italian teams, it was a black day. «A» team lost to Israel, but offered a very good resistance taking 1,5 point, while »B» (young lions) and «C» team lost with the same result, cashing just half a point.

By women, four teams are still with perfect score: China, France, Lithuania and Latvia. They will meet in round three (China-France,



Lithuania-Latvia). Half a point behind them are seven teams: Russia, Poland, Israel, Hungary, Mongolia, Romania and Italy «A» who joined such a high society by beating Columbia with 2,5:0,5. I am pretty sure that their match against Romania will be today in the centre of attention of all visitors and medias as well. Italy «B» added some cream on the cake cashing all three points against Chinese Taipei. In that way Italian ladies successfully revenged their countrymen.

Yesterday a couple of open tournaments started immediately after the end of the second round. Torino 2006 is a real chess «fiesta»!

# Game of the day

Because the technical reasons there was no annotated game in the first bulletin. So today we give a double portion...

This was the game on board 1 in the most interesting match of the first round which ended in a shocking surprise. White prepares himself to push the c pawn to c4 while preventing an eventual check on b4. Here White accepted a draw offer in a position where his edge is beyond any doubt. The reason? Well, probably for tactical reasons, because it was already clear that match is going very well for Morocco.
