Status Quo maintained

Yesterday a strange thing happened in men's section. First five matches ended 2:2 and with no high victories behind them a perfect status quo was maintained. To avoid any misunderstanding, they were all fought just until the last soldier.

Let's start from the beginning. Russia put for the first time their basic line-up which looks frightening with its average of 2730 elo points. However it was not enough to defeat Armenia whose rating average was «only» 2680 points!

Kramnik produced one more beautiful piece of pure positional chess against Aroinian, Svidler and Grischuk drew against Akopian and Asrian, but Morozevich was outplayed by Sargissian in a way which usually puts him on the winning side. In match number two Dutch players were long-time in lead thanks to Tiviakov, but at the end Kasimdzhanov equalized the score. This was a strange game, where Sokolov very early overlooked a pawn, then managed to take it back, then lost it again, took it back again and finally lost slightly worse rook endgame when he was already close to draw. I'm sure that Spain was hoping for more, but they didn't manage to defeat Sweden. The reason is a surprising defeat of Vallejo against Hellsten, so that the victory of Illescas was enough just to equalize the score.

Ukraine and Bulgaria drew in the same way. Ivanchuk recovered quickly from his loss against Kasimdzhanov and won against Kiril Georgiev (see the comments), but this time Volokitin lost to Cheparinov, who is one of Topalov's seconds and a player of the same sharp style. It seems like Black lost on time, since in the final position, although being clearly worse, he could still continue.

Only in the fifth match between India and China all four games ended in a draw, but after a big fight. It seems, however, that Anand's position was suspicious, as a consequence of the risk he took in the middlegame. On the other hand it is quite understandable that Indian players must try to compensate their loss from the first round at any cost.

The situation on the top is now: Russia and Armenia 15,5 points, Netherlands 15, Uzbekistan 14,5 followed by a group of 7 teams with 14 points: Ukraine, Spain, Bul-

ria, Sweden, USA, Belarus and Iran (!) as a most positive surprise.

The most negative one until now is certainly England, only on 12,5 points, with two such strong front players as are Adams and Short!

It was not a lucky day for Italian teams. «A» lost to Poland 2,5:1,5, «B» to Malaysia 1:3, only «C» managed to maintain the balance against Austria.

Top pairings for round six are: Netherlands-Russia, Armenia-Uzbekistan, Sweden-Bulgaria, Ukraine-Iran, Belarus-Spain and China-USA.

After their frightening start, Russian women showed that they are also vulnerable human beings and lost a big derby against Ukraine with 1:2. A decisive game was played on board number one, where Zhukova defeated Kosteniuk. Russia is still in lead with 12,5 points, but Ukraine is now just half a point behind. This tournament could easily become a two teams show. Hungary is now third with 11,5 points after their splendid victory, 2,5:0,5 against the defending champions of China. It seems that this Chinese team which is clearly not their best one, will not be able to defend the title. A group of 8 teams follows with 11 points: Bulgaria, USA, Romania, India, Armenia, Spain, Mongolia and Slovenia.

Italy «A» drew with Germany keeping so their position close to the top, but «B» team lost to Philippines 0,5:2,5.

Top pairings for round six are: Russia-Hungary, Spain-Ukraine, Mongolia-Ukraine, Romania-Armenia, India-Slovenia and Kazakhstan-Bulgaria.

Tomorrow is a rest day, so the leaders can enjoy their positions for 48 hours. However, a lot of other things will be happening in the tournament hall, like the World Championship for computers, so don't miss the show!

Please, shut down the mobile!

In the third round of Chess Olympiad, the first defeat by telephone was recorded: it happened in the Albania-Sweden encounter, as soon as it begun, after the third move, when the mobile phone of the albanian Shabanaj started ringing.

The arbiter on duty was ready to step in and obviously assigned the loss to Albania. The arbiter was the Italian Angelino Trapani, from the province of Cosenza, his first Olympiad and his first experience with phone disturbances.

“Now, after the many cases happened in tournaments” has declared Franca Dapiran, deputy arbiter, responsible for the female field, “the Fide regulations are quite strict for these situations: the players cannot use the telephone during the game not even on silence or with the vibrator on. If the phone rings the game is lost. In any case, at the beginning of every encounter the arbiter has to warn the players to turn off their telephones”.

The reason for this rule is clear: the players cannot receive help from others via telephone or to disturb the opponents and other players.

The arbiter Trapani tells: “The Albanian girls of first and third chessboard had arrived when the clock was past two minutes. They had begun to play when the player of the third chessboard telephone rang loudly. The girl opened up her purse and quickly turned it off, but Christin Andersson from Sweden noted that the ringing of the telephone of the adversary and got the attention of her captain. I immediately acted and assigned the loss to the Albanian player as per the regulations. Her two team mates become obviously nervous and lost concentration, so that in the end the Swedens won by 3 to 0”.

Here are the played moves: 1. d4, d5 2. c4, c6 3 Cf3, d:c4 and at that point the telephone rang.

Chess in Nepal

The Nepal Chess Federation was formed 30 years ago but there were chess tournaments played as early as 100 years as well. Nepal got the Fide recognition in 1985 and has started participating in Chess Olympiad since Calvia in 2004. The president of Nepal chess federation Sitaram Agrahari said we need expert coaches and sponsorship from Fide.

Already the world chess association has supported us through "cacdec" by books, and now we are hoping that we will get a Grandmaster coach from Fide.

The registered players in himalayan kingdom are 5000 and there are regular tournaments and you can see chess being played in cafe and streets as it is the most popular sport after football and cricket. Within 2 or 3 years we have climbed to 116 in the Fide country rating and our best player is Digesh Shankar Malla who is rated 2257 and current national champion. We would like to organize international tournaments and also participate in the international arena event. Another promising player is Kesav Shrestha who is expected to become an international master. Cricket and football get many support and we need the backing of Fide and other international organization to develop chess in Nepal. We welcome all chess players to visit our

beautiful country and in 1970 world chess champion Max Euwe had visited Nepal and in a simultaneous display a Nepal player had in fact defeated him. His visit opened up the doors for enhanced development of chess in Nepal and we would like to extend an invitation to top players like Viswanathan Anand, Vaseelin Topalov and Vladimir Kramnik to visit us as part of being Fide cultural ambassadors and give us the momentum to further develop chess in the Kingdom. British Grandmaster Nigel Short has also shown interest to visit us in the future.

F o r m e r fide president **F l o r e n c i o** Campomanes visited us in 1985 and he saw the chess culture in Nepal and gave us the entry to Fide. We are very delighted to meet him here and we express our sincere thanks to him and to current president Mr. Kirsan for contributing to the development of chess. We have creativity and hard work but need corporate sponsorship.



Il salotto degli scacchi

In piazza San Carlo from May 23 it's opened of "Torino: il salotto degli scacchi".

Chess is not only played at the Lingotto Oval, where the matches of the 37th Olympiad are taking place, but also in other places in the city, such as piazza San Carlo, where "Torino: il salotto degli scacchi" is located: a battle field, clearly a peaceful one, where you can play on the chessboards of four "houses".

India House, Persia House, Arabia House and Europe House will host sixteen tables with all the necessary pieces and chessboards (one for each House) and these become the stages on which strategies and techniques can be shown, with presentation of historical matches of the great champions of the past and the reading of literary pieces dedicated to the world of rooks, knights, bishops, kings and queens.

Each house represents - and tells of - a historical period and a geographical area in the history of chess from its beginnings and the spread of the game throughout Europe.

The form of the chessboards recalls the Countries to which the four houses are dedicated. For example, the Persia House pieces have the same appearance as the ones in use in the X cent. A.D., while the Arabia House pieces have the shape of Arabic numbers. In each house a "salotto" will be furnished with pieces that emphasize its origin even more.



In the Houses of the "salotto degli scacchi" some chess association experts will organize matches and small tournaments and will give lessons to new players.

In order to involve visitors even more in the understanding of chess, the activities programmed in piazza San Carlo will be staged again, with the same schedule, from May 31 to June 4 at the Cortile del Maglio, in Borgo Dora.

Chess in Luxemburg

Met the chess playing family from Luxemburg where father, mother, sister and brother are all chess players. Fioan Steil-Antoni second board player for Luxemburg team is from high school and she said this is my second Olympiad and I found playing conditions are ideal and Olympic village is good and nice to have all players in one roof as per Fide regulation. dual and group lessons. I have played in Bundesliga and have played in youth chess festival in France. And there is encouragement from school and the chess federation as well we need more international events and we are planning to organize in 2007.

We have national championship and very big club championship and there are 8 teams in the first division. I have been working with Jansa for 6 years, favorite book is endgame university by Dvořtsky. I prepare about 2 hours a day using computers and self study. There are about 500 registered players and almost every week-end there is a chess tournament happening. For juniors there are many events and chess is developing well my aim is to become a grandmaster. I am also hoping to visit new countries and it is possible to become a professional in Luxemburg if you are strong chess player.

World Computer Championship

If master chess is considered a symbol of intellectual activity, but is nevertheless fully human (look at players in zeitnot if you don't believe it), computer chess represents the world of pure ideas. This is what you can feel strolling from the Olympiad hall to the area where two very special tournaments started today. Here is on the stage the 14th world Computer Chess Championship that sees the participation of 18 softwares from many countries. It will take 11 rounds to decide who will be the 2006 world champion, the last of a story that dates back to 1974, when the first championship took place. Initially the title was awarded every three years, but, interestingly, in the 1998 it was not possible to find a sponsor because of the sensational loss of Kasparov to Deep Blue in 1997.

Human envy? Maybe, but only in 2002 it could be possible to assign a new title. It is not hard to imagine what tremendous improvement hardware and software have done championship to championship, up to the present strength. "Some of these programs are far stronger than any human grandmaster there in the Olympiads" says with confidence arbiter Van den Herik, adding that software can reach ratings higher than 4000, when the human top is around 2850.

It is really a different world. First of all, you can give a close look at the players and even making your own comments without being expelled by the arbiter. Nothing disturbs the computers, not even cellular phones, and some of them are even not physically present. Crafty, for instance, is actually running on a supercomputer with parallel processors in a north American university, while his today opponent Urugano3D plays

Yes, computing power is important, they say, but the capacity to give a proper assessment of each position is equally or more decisive.

So basically this is an open tournament. In principle every program can take part into the swiss round championship, unless the sponsors put some limits to the total number, but of course a prior knowledge of the strength of the program is appreciated. Thus it happens that in every championship you always find otherwise little known local



programmers who have the chance to match their babies with the best in the field. And so in Turin 6 softwares are italian, created by people who do it just for fun. "I am not neither an engineer nor a mathematician, and my background is of classical studies" proudly says Luca Naddei, happy that his program lost only after a very long struggle against a famous opponent. It is refreshing to learn that formerly unknown programs can reach the top, demonstrating that the ingenuity of a single author can still make the difference over well developed commercial software. The 2005 championship in Reykjavik showed a great surprise, when the unknown Zappa swept away all the favorites with an incredible 10½/11.

Shall we see something like that in Turin too? In a few days the answer!

One could expect that you should need equal hardware to decide which software is the best, but this is not the case, as programmers can develop their softwares for well defined computer configurations, that are thus needed to work properly.

Is this fair? If you ask the question to the programmers they don't look worried at all.
